ARRIVE, UNWIND & EXPLORE

Exmouth is easy to reach and even easier to explore once you arrive. With trains, buses, bikes, ferries and taxis all readily available, getting around is simple. Once you're here, slow down, leave the car keys behind and discover Exmouth on foot, by bus or by bike.

By Train

Exmouth is served by a regular service from Exeter on the scenic Avocet Line. This stunning 25-minute journey runs along the eastern side of the Exe Estuary, offering beautiful views along the way.

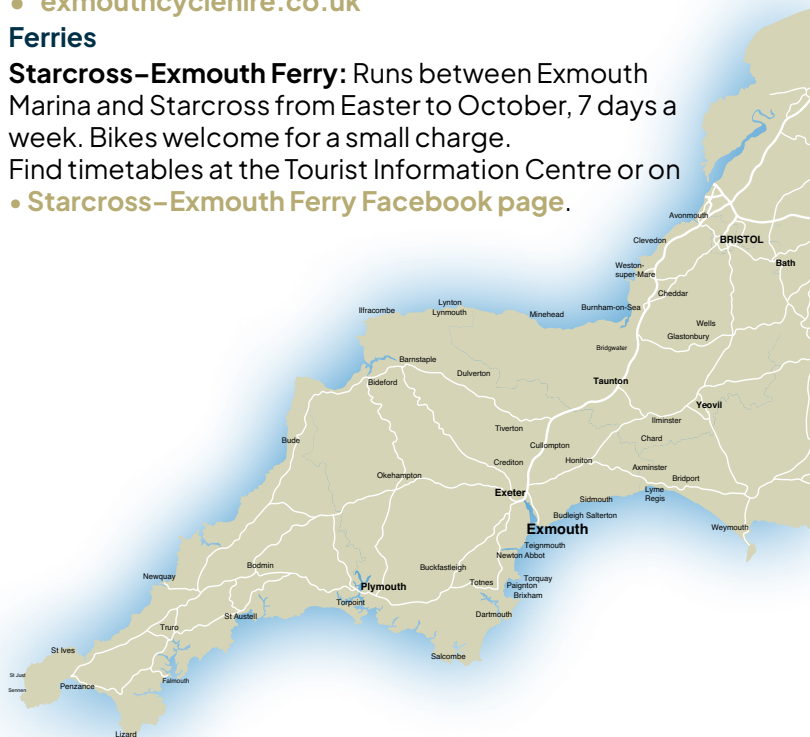

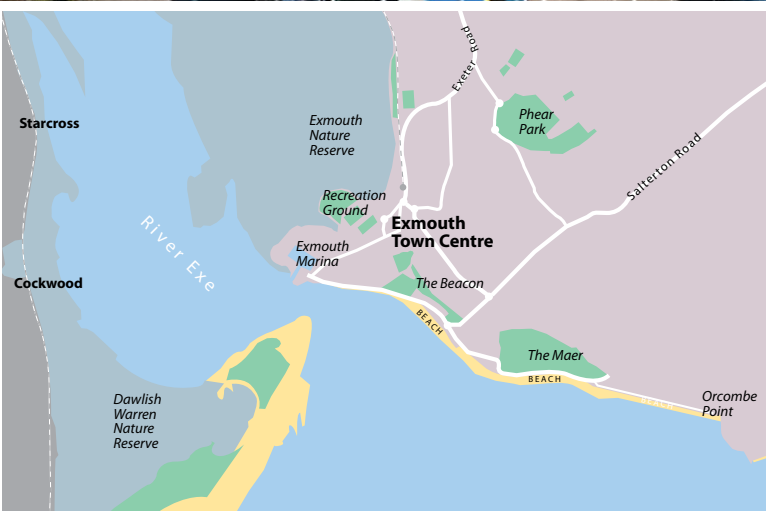
Ferries

DISCOVERING EXMOUTH



With so many great places to visit across the UK, Exmouth might not be on your radar — yet! This guide introduces you to one of Devon’s most picturesque seaside towns, where the River Exe meets the sea.

Exmouth enjoys a unique location with estuary and sea views on two sides, plus countryside and town views inland. It boasts the longest seafront in Devon and Cornwall, with two miles of golden sand and fascinating rock pools — ideal for families, beachcombers, walkers and eco-friendly travellers.

It’s also a regional hub for watersports like kitesurfing, windsurfing, kayaking, paddleboarding and sailing. The modern watersports centre, opened in 2021, sits alongside cafés, restaurants and amenities along the Esplanade.

At the eastern end of the beach, you’ll find the gateway to the **Jurassic Coast World Heritage Site**, with stunning cliff and coastal walks. **Exmouth is part of the Southwest Coast Path**, offering spectacular walking routes along the coastline.

Just minutes from the seafront is the lively town centre, with The Strand at its heart — a pedestrianised square filled with shops, cafés, pubs, and an indoor market. Nearby are the Magnolia Centre, Manor Gardens, Exmouth Marina, and the railway station.

Families can enjoy themed walking trails like the Dinosaur Trail and the Blue Plaque Heritage Trail, which highlights the town's history.

Beyond the town, the **Exe Estuary Trail** offers scenic walking and cycling along the Avocet Line, connecting Exmouth to Exeter and Dawlish. The estuary is a haven for wildlife and part of one of Devon's largest nature reserves. You can also take a cruise or ferry across to Starcross. Exmouth makes a great base for exploring Devon — with Dartmoor, Exeter, and other East Devon towns all within easy reach.

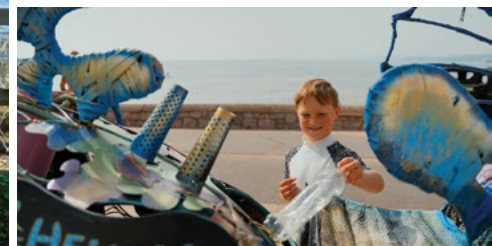

BEACH LIFE

Stretching over two miles of golden sand, Exmouth Beach is perfect for sunbathing, swimming, and scenic strolls. As part of the Jurassic Coast World Heritage Site, it offers breathtaking views of dramatic cliffs and the estuary.



The vibrant Promenade runs parallel to the beach and is a hub of activity year-round. It's a great place to relax and soak up the coastal atmosphere, whether you're enjoying an ice cream or dining at one of the cafés or restaurants along the way. With seating areas and gardens, the Promenade makes for a pleasant walk for visitors of all ages.

Sideshore is home to an award-winning eco hub for watersports. The beach's sheltered waters and reliable winds make it ideal for learning and enjoying a wide range of Watersports and wellness activities. From kitesurfing to paddleboarding, Exmouth has it all.

For nature lovers and families, Exmouth is also a fantastic spot for rock pooling. Head towards Orcombe Point at low tide to discover fascinating marine life — a fun and educational activity for all ages. Before heading out, especially for estuary walks or rock pooling, be sure to check tide times, which can change quickly and dramatically.



Safe by the Sea

Exmouth takes coastal safety seriously, giving you peace of mind while enjoying the beach.

RNLI Lifeguards patrol Exmouth Beach during peak season (check RNLI website for dates), from 10am–6pm. Swim between the red and yellow flags and never enter the water when the red flag is flying.

Exmouth RNLI lifeboat station houses a R & J Welburn Shannon class lifeboat and the George Bearman II inshore D Class. The volunteer crew trains every Wednesday evening, launching at around 6.15pm with recovery around 8.30pm. Visit the station viewing gallery above the RNLI shop to see the lifeboats and SLARS vehicle. Free Lifeboat station tours are available, visit website for information.

National Coastwatch Institution (NCI) volunteers monitor the coast year-round from their lookout above Harbour View Café.

A COASTAL HAVEN FOR ALL

Exmouth prides itself on being an inclusive, welcoming destination where everyone can enjoy the sea and sand with ease. The town features a flat, wide promenade stretching from the Marina to Orcombe Point—perfect for wheelchair users, families with pushchairs, and anyone who prefers an accessible route along the seafront.



Beach Wheelchairs

Thanks to the Exmouth Beach Wheelchair Project, specially adapted chairs with balloon-style wheels are available free of charge during the main season from a purpose-built unit on Queens Drive near the lifeboat station. The eco-friendly unit includes a

ramp, solar panels, and rainwater collection for cleaning. Several chairs for adults and children, including floating chairs are provided by Exmouth Town Council. Additional equipment includes a stand aid, hoist, harnesses, headrests, straps, umbrellas, and cushions. The service runs April–October and is volunteer-led. Toilets & Changing Places

Disabled facilities are available in all public toilets. RADAR keys are required at Exmouth Train Station, Magnolia Centre, and Phear Park (available from Tourist Information for £5). A Changing Places toilet on the seafront offers height-adjustable benches, hoists, and spacious layouts for dignity and comfort.

Parking

East Devon District Council car parks have dedicated disabled bays (charges apply). Blue Badge holders often park free in on-street locations—check Devon County Council for details.

Whether you're here for a stroll, a family day out, or an active adventure, Exmouth ensures everyone can enjoy its vibrant seafront with confidence.

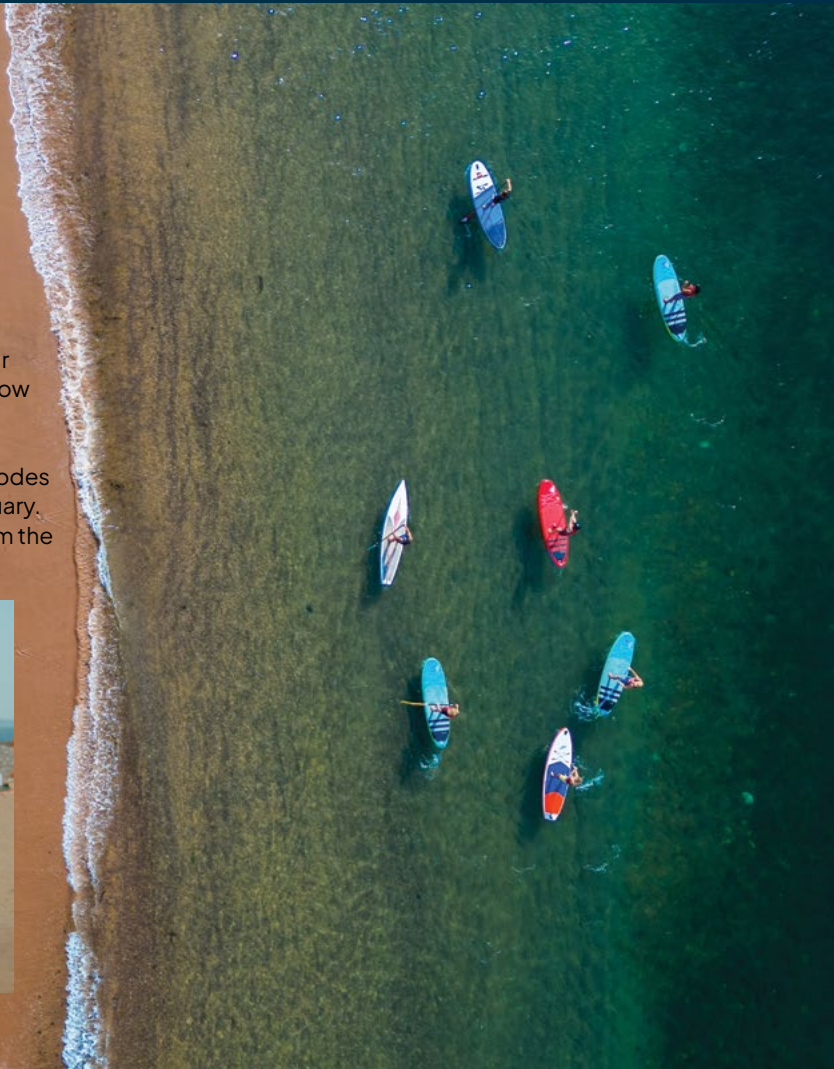
EXPLORE ON THE WATER

With the calm waters of the Exe Estuary on one side and the open sea on the other, Exmouth is one of the South West's best natural playgrounds for water-based adventures. From kayaking and paddleboarding to kitesurfing and sailing, there's something for every age and ability to enjoy.

Stay Safe on the Water

While Exmouth is a fantastic location for watersports, the area is known for strong tides and changing conditions—especially near the open sea and rocky areas. Always check local tide times, follow RNLI safety guidance, and consult with local instructors before heading out.

To help visitors enjoy the water safely and responsibly, a set of Codes of Conduct for Water Users has been developed for the Exe Estuary. These can be downloaded at exe-estuary.org or requested from the Tourist Information Centre.



Here's a rundown of all the action available:
Exmouth Gig Rowing Club

The club rows traditional Cornish pilot gig boats—34 feet long and painted in bright orange. Each boat carries six rowers and a coxswain, with rowers handling 13-foot oars. Historically, these gigs raced to reach incoming ships off the rugged South West coast; the first pilot aboard won the contract and paid their crew. Today, you'll spot these striking boats on the Exe Estuary, either enjoying a social row or training hard for the next regatta. Every June, Exmouth Gig Rowing Club hosts its own regatta off the main beach, welcoming clubs from across the Jurassic Coast. It's a spectacular sight—boats in vibrant colours, crews ready for muscle-testing competition.

Exmouth's club is thriving and growing fast, offering people of all ages the chance to experience this exciting sport—whether for fitness, fun, or competitive racing.

- Exmouth Rowing Club**

Formed in November 1993, the club is a sporting and visual highlight for the town with its striking boats. Training takes place in stable 220kg offshore rowing boats—ideal for beginners to master technique quickly while offering great resistance for fitness.

For those ready to progress, the club competes in fine-boat river races (Olympic-style rowing) and offshore regattas using two FISA-approved boats—lighter, faster, and built for performance.

Kitesurfing

Exmouth is widely regarded as one of the top kitesurfing destinations in the country. At high tide, the “Duck Pond” in the Exe Estuary provides flat, shallow water that’s perfect for learners and freestyle practice. When the tide drops, experienced riders head to the seafront sandbank, where large areas of flat water and rolling swell create the perfect playground for big jumps and fast runs.

Thanks to consistent south-westerly winds and ample launch space, kitesurfers of all levels will find ideal conditions throughout much of the year.

Exmouth is home to Team Bridge, a world-class kitesurfing family. Learn from champions Steph and Eric at Edge Watersports based at Sideshore.

Plus the South West Coast Path and Exmouth – Budleigh Old Railway for tail-wagging adventures.

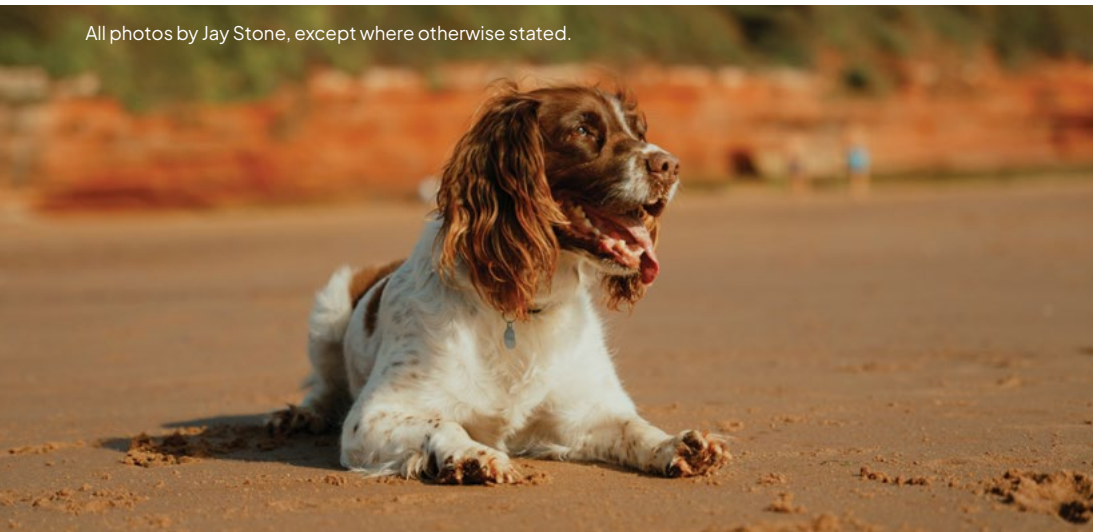
Doggy Days Out



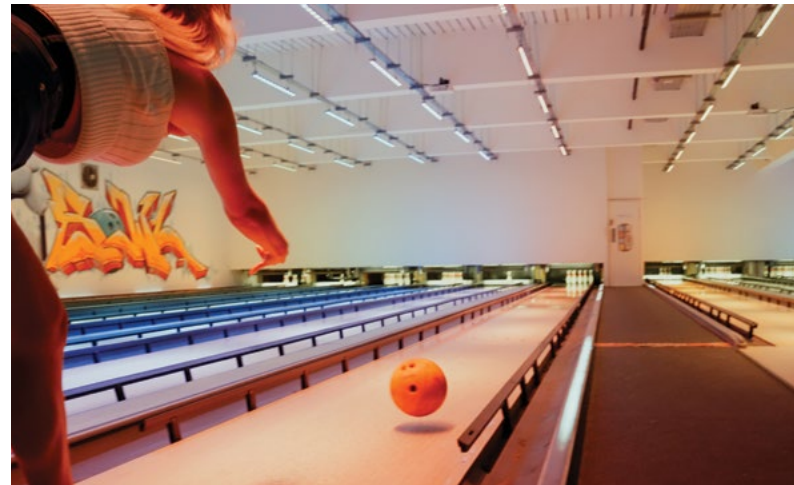

JURASSIC COAST

Exmouth is proud to be the gateway to the Jurassic Coast. At Orcombe Point, the eastern end of the beach marks the start of England's only Natural World Heritage Site—a unique 95-mile coastline spanning 185 million years of Earth's history. It showcases a continuous sequence of Triassic, Jurassic, and Cretaceous rock formations. You don't need a geology degree to admire the striking red cliffs, formed in a desert during the Triassic period.

Walk the coastal path to Orcombe Point and discover the GeoNeedle, a sculpture made from rocks found along the World Heritage coastline. Designed by artist Michael Fairfax, it was unveiled in 2002 by HRH The Prince of Wales (now King Charles III).

Top tips:

Walk the cliff path or the beach at low tide for stunning views. Check tide times to avoid getting stranded.

Stay away from cliff edges and bases—erosion and rockfalls are common.

Keep dogs on leads.

Visit in different seasons to see the landscape transform.

NATURAL BEAUTY

Exmouth is surrounded by stunning landscapes, from the Exmouth Local Nature Reserve to the East Devon Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and the Pebblebed Heaths. Nature is everywhere—and that’s part of the charm.

From estuary mudflats to rolling heathland and manicured gardens, Exmouth’s natural beauty is diverse and accessible year-round. Whether you’re birdwatching, hiking, or simply relaxing outdoors, there’s always something new to discover.

Exmouth Local Nature Reserve

Known locally as the “duckpond,” this vast tidal area at the southern end of the Exe Estuary is a haven for wildlife. Each autumn, thousands of birds migrate from the Arctic to overwinter here, creating one of Devon’s most spectacular sights. Look out for dark-bellied brent geese in September and winter flocks of wigeon and pintail ducks. The Exe Estuary Management Partnership has produced a variety of publications on different aspects of the Exe Estuary. These can be viewed and downloaded from its website or picked up from the Tourist Information Office.

The Maer Local Nature Reserve

Just behind the beach, the Maer's is ideal quiet retreat away from the beach and is home to an abundance of wildlife. Sandy soil supports rare insects and skylarks, it's also a popular barbecue spot, with free-to-use facilities maintained by East Devon District Council, available on a first come first served basis.

Bystock Nature Reserve

Explore heathland, wildflower meadows, woodland, and ponds. On summer nights listen for the churring calls of nightjars and search for the pale green lights of glow worms. Managed by Devon Wildlife Trust, it features marked trails, allow 1 hour to complete a circular walk. Dogs are welcome on lead.

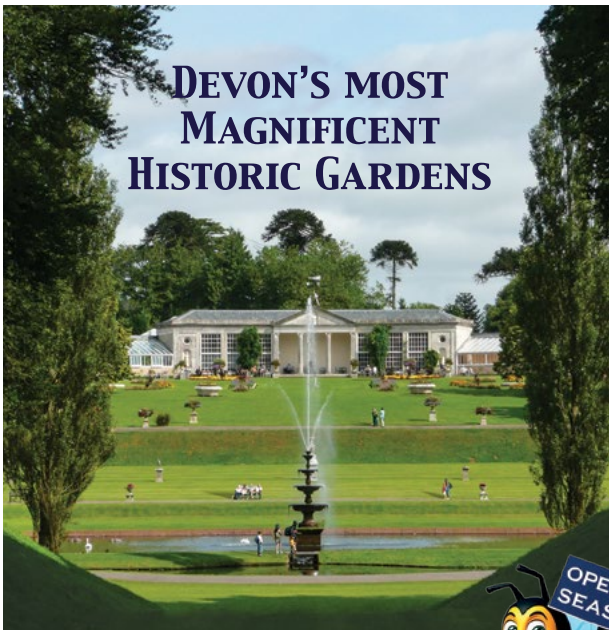
Gardens & Bicton Park

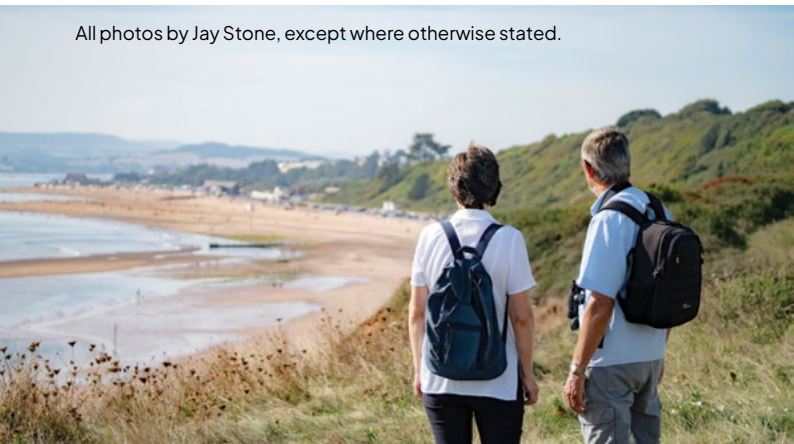

Step into Exmouth's rich past and lively present. From its elegant Georgian roots as Devon's first fashionable resort to today's thriving arts scene, Exmouth offers a unique blend of heritage, culture, and coastal charm. Explore historic landmarks, discover local artists, and immerse yourself in festivals that celebrate creativity all year round.

A Brief History

Exmouth's rise as a popular English seaside resort began in the late 18th century, when the French Revolution and Napoleonic Wars halted overseas travel for the wealthy. Aristocrats turned to Britain's coast and spa towns for leisure and health, and Exmouth became a fashionable destination.

Notable residents of this era included Lady Byron, wife of poet Lord Byron; Lady Nelson, estranged wife of Admiral Lord Nelson; and Mary Ann Clarke, the infamous mistress of the Duke of York.

Before the 1700s, Exmouth was a modest fishing town. Sir Walter Raleigh, born nearby in East Budleigh in 1544, sailed from here on many of his voyages.

The arrival of the railway in 1861 opened Exmouth to middle and working-class visitors, and its popularity soared. A 1923 guide described Exmouth as "the sunny resort of the west" and "perhaps the fairest section of our native land."

Today, you can explore 250 million years of geological history along the Jurassic Coast or discover Exmouth's elegant architecture and heritage as Devon's first fashionable holiday resort.

- **A la Ronde** – A unique 16-sided National Trust house built by the Parminter cousins after their European travels.
- **Blue Plaque Trail** – Pick up a leaflet from the Tourist Information Service.

Along the Seafront
Sideshore is not only a hub for watersports but also a hotspot for foodies. 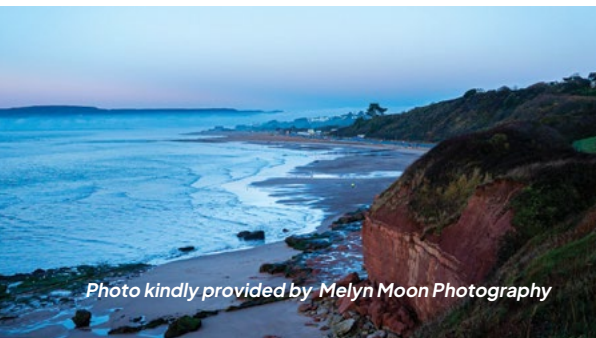

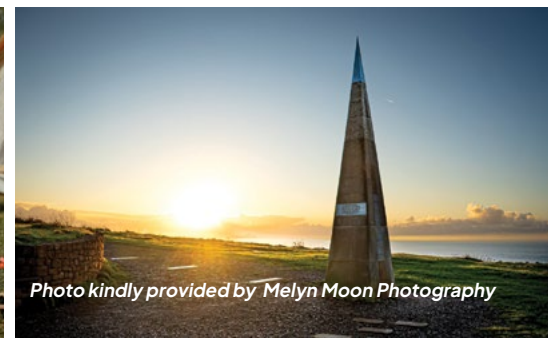

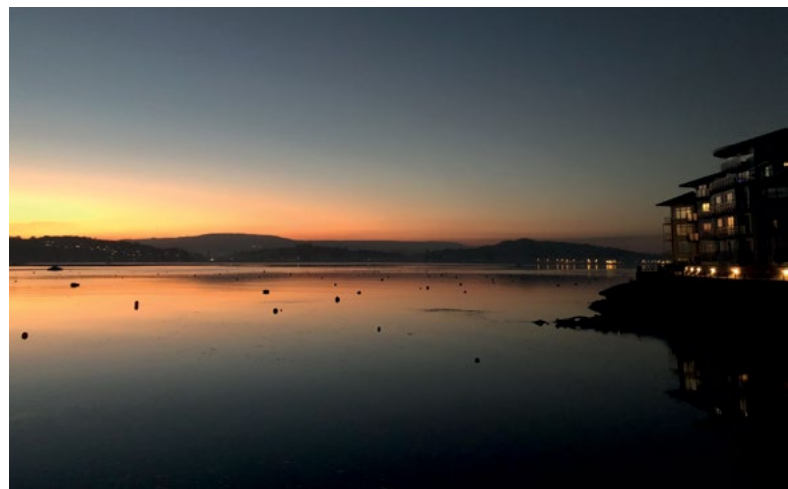
